SOCIETY MEETING PROGRAM

AMBER - "THAT FANTASTIC TREE RESIN"

Maxine Dearborn will walk us through the gem stone.

Yes, Amber, like Pearls, is one of the few non-mineral gemstones.

Amber comes in many colors and she will have samples for you to see and touch. Maxine will go from where Amber is found and what it looks like in the rough, to finished items in jewelry.

You will also learn how to polish and take care of your Amber. You will want your own Amber necklace after this program.



September 10th Class

In anticipation of our October show, I will assist members who want to make liners for our club showcases.

I have enough materials to cover one liner base. If you are interested in making one for yourself, you will need to purchase a 30 x 40 piece of 1/8 or 1/4 inch thick foam core board. I will have fabric to cover the board in darker tan and cream colors. We need to use an Xacto knife with a sharp blade to cut the board. I have clear packing tape to join the pieces. To tape the fabric to the board we will use duct tape. If you have some, some please bring it.

If you have a color preference for the fabric here are some measurements to consider. You need a piece that is 50 inches by 27 inches. Neutral colors are best – tan, grey, cream or off-white. Knits are a little harder to work with, but usable – cotton/polyester are fine. No patterns or textures.

September Birthstone – Sapphire

We all recognize blue sapphires stones as their color is well known. Besides occurring in multiple colors, the red color is called ruby, there is a lesser know version of sapphire – star sapphire. This occurs naturally when titanium oxide crystalizes first and then the sapphire crystalizes around it. This causes the 6 or 12 rayed star we see in cabochon cut stones. Man made star sapphires have been produced in deep pink (ruby) as well as blue. The cabochon has a hardness and durability the same as natural stones.

FINISHING PIERCED PATTERNS

After sawing patterns there's always a little cleanup to do, and the smaller cutouts can be a challenge. Needle files (7-8 inches) can get into the larger areas, and escapement files (4 inches) can get into some of the corners.

But I often find myself wanting even smaller files. I couldn't find them, even at a watchmaker tools supply company, so I had to try something else. I ended up grinding down the tip of a small 4" barrette file using a separating disk (or cutoff wheel) in your Dremel or Foredom.

Be sure to wear your safety glasses when using this tool. A flake of steel in your eye makes for a bad day.



SMALL PARTS CONTAINERS

I'm always on the lookout for small containers to use for holding all those little parts and tools we deal with in making jewelry, especially since I'm always traveling to classes and workshops.

My latest find are some plastic vials about 15 mm in diameter and 75 mm long. Best part is they are free. The vials are used in the doctor's office to draw blood samples. They cannot be used after their expiration date and are thrown out. On my last doctors visit, I asked the nurse if they had any expired vials. She replied "How many do you want?" and tried to give me 400 of them. (We settled on 200).

The ones shown above are called "Vacutainers", but there are probably many other names. They're clear plastic with a rubber stopper and a paper label all ready to write on. I find them really handy for small parts like jump rings, prong settings, small drills, nuts & bolts, faceted stones, and precious metal filings.


