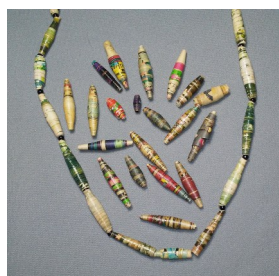
SOCIETY MEETING PROGRAM

For August 13th we will take a break from jewelry making to learn and produce the raffle tickets for our show in October. August Birthstones

In 2016, August joined June and December as one of the three birth months represented by three different gemstones. The original birthstone for August was sardonyx, and then peridot was added, becoming August's primary gemstone. The addition of spinel, which can be found in a variety of colors, gives August babies a plethora of options!



Just Plain Rocks.....And Minerals

What are rocks? We see that they are hard masses of consolidated material, varying in size, color and content. They may be as small as a grain of sand, or as large as a mountain. They may be black, brown or multi-colored --- and they make up the earth's crust.

Geologists know that rocks may consist of a single mineral (Gold, etc.) or contain a combination of several useful minerals. For example, a pegmatite rock may contain mica, feldspar, quartz ---and GEMS.

For definition....."A MINERAL is a natural substance found in nature and having definite physical and chemical properties. Its special characteristics are determined by a regular arrangement of the atomic structure within it.

There are approximately 2000 minerals known, but less than two dozen are found in abundance throughout the world.

A mineral may be identified by its chemical content, color, appearance, cleavage, crystal form, hardness, luster, specific gravity, etc. i.e.;

A few are attracted by a magnet. (iron)

Some conduct electricity better than others. (copper)

Some fluorescent ores glow under ultra violet lights. (fluorite)

Some have varied electrical properties, or different reactions to heat and high temperatures.

Some are radioactive and emit rays at great speed. The rays cannot be heard, seen, or felt, but are detected by special equipment. (For example, pitchblende emits about 1200 counts per minute as shown by a geiger counter.)

Nature's minerals are classified as metallic (gold, copper) or non-metallic (graphite, sulfur, etc.). They may be as soft as talc, or as hard as diamond.

The powerful link between man and earth is as great today as it was thousands of years ago when he made his tools, weapons, and decorations from simple stones. Rocks and their minerals continue to provide the basic needs for civilization and live as we know it today.

FINISHING PIERCED PATTERNS

After sawing patterns there's always a little cleanup to do, and the smaller cutouts can be a challenge. Needle files (7-8 inches) can get into the larger areas, and escapement files (4 inches) can get into some of the corners.

But I often find myself wanting even smaller files. I couldn't find them, even at a watchmaker tools supply company, so I had to try something else. I ended up grinding down the tip of a small 4" barrette file using a separating disk (or cutoff wheel) in your Dremel or Foredom.

Be sure to wear your safety glasses when using this tool. A flake of steel in your eye makes for a bad day.



SMALL PARTS CONTAINERS

I'm always on the lookout for small containers to use for holding all those little parts and tools we deal with in making jewelry, especially since I'm always traveling to classes and workshops.

My latest find are some plastic vials about 15 mm in diameter and 75 mm long. Best part is they are free. The vials are used in the doctor's office to draw blood samples. They cannot be used after their expiration date and are thrown out. On my last doctors visit, I asked the nurse if they had any expired vials. She replied "How many do you want?" and tried to give me 400 of them. (We settled on 200).

The ones shown above are called "Vacutainers", but there are probably many other names. They're clear plastic with a rubber stopper and a paper label all ready to write on. I find them really handy for small parts like jump rings, prong settings, small drills, nuts & bolts, faceted stones, and precious metal filings.
