
Gemstone of the Month

Diamond Birthstone Meaning & History

Our love for the April birthstone started in India, where diamonds were gathered from the country's rivers and streams. Traded as early as the fourth century BCE, diamonds were coveted by royalty and the wealthy. Later, caravans brought Indian diamonds, along with other exotic merchandise, to medieval markets in Venice. By the 1400s, diamonds were becoming fashionable accessories for Europe's elite. The first diamond engagement ring on record was given by Archduke Maximillian of Austria to his betrothed, Mary of Burgundy, in 1477. Recent evidence supports the origin of the legendary 45.52 carat (ct) blue Hope diamond in India's Golconda mining area and its sale to King Louis XIV of France (then known as the French Blue diamond) in 1668.

In the early 1700s, as India's diamond supplies began to decline, Brazil emerged as an important source. Diamonds were discovered when gold miners sifted through gravels on the banks of the Jequitinhonha River in Minas Gerais. Brazil dominated the diamond market for more than 150 years.

The discovery of diamonds near Kimberley, South Africa, in the late 1860s marked the beginning of the modern diamond market. Entrepreneur Cecil Rhodes established De Beers Consolidated Mines Limited in 1888, and by 1900 De Beers controlled an estimated 90 percent of the world's production of rough diamonds. The largest diamond ever found – at 3,106 ct (621 grams) – was recovered from South Africa's Premier mine in 1905. From it was cut the pear shaped 530 ct Cullinan I diamond, also known as the Great Star of Africa, which is now set in the Royal Sceptre with Cross and housed with the other Crown Jewels in the Tower of London.

COLLECTION MATERIAL – Geodes. Porcelain Jasper

PROPOSED SCHEDULE - Meet up and conduct safety meeting each day before convoying to collection sites. MEET (where/when) – Near intersection of Wiley's Well Rd and Hauser Geode Beds Road 0900 hours daily

DIRECTIONS TO SITE/CAMP - Take I-10 Wiley Well exit before Blythe, travel south on blacktop to CA State Prison then south on rough gravel road past Wiley Well and Coon Hollow BLM campgrounds to Hauser Geode Bed Road, where vehicles will congregate at 9 am each morning. Camping at BLM Coon Hollow Campground

VEHICLE REQ'S - recommend 4x4 or carpooling with a 4x4

CAMP/FACILITIES - Coon Hollow is a BLM fee required, gravel pads dry camp with pit toilets, shaded picnic tables and no hookups. There are several motels in Blythe (consult Google or Apple Maps for names)

TOOLS – Shovel, bucket, hoe or cultivator rake, rock hammer, safety glasses, work gloves

SAFETY CONCERNS - potential for heat or cold (layers), dehydration, sunscreen and full coverage hats, rattlesnakes and scorpions, slips-trips-falls (bring first aid kit), rough roads

CLIMATE/WEATHER - variable this time of year in the Mojave Desert, bring lots of water and sunscreen CLOTHING - long pants and shirts - dress in layers, hiking boots recommended, sun protection (full cover) hats OTHER REMARKS - The BLM and CFMS have a Memorandum of Agreement (MOU) to allow recreational (not commercial) collection of geodes at the Hauser Geode Beds.

The Bureau of Land Management Geologist and Scientist staff will give a presentation at the dig site on the geology, wildlife and historical significance of the region on April 19th.

CFMS requests that you, if able, clean up after yourself (fill holes, etc.) and help pick up any loose trash left by others at the sites. Recommend using BLM trash bags to clean up areas as needed. After their talk. BLM staff will haul collected trash out. Field trips will end daily at 4 pm.

Bring your own water and lunches.

Remember to donate some of your finds to your society when you return.

FEES - Nominal camping fees at Coon Hollow Campground, none currently at dig sites.

Our class on April 13th will be fusing Dichroic Glass. Thalia will have all the tools and materials needed. We will be using a Quick-Fire kiln for the fusing. As this takes quite a bit of time to cool down after each firing, we will not get more than 2 firings on the class day. The remaining fusing loads will have to be done later. Finished items will be brought to the general meeting on April 20th. Class fee: \$5.00. Glass: \$20.00 – for 4 projects.



Last month's class

On March 9th Debbie and Thalia worked on the Egyptian Pendant. This was more challenging than we expected. Debbie's example was made with "tear drop" shaped beads. We used oval or round beads. The basic problem was making a bundle of 9 wires. Not an easy task to keep them aligned, flat and square. We solved that by making bundles of 4 and 5 wires and then joining the two bundles together. We were successful and OK with the finished project.

Special Report from Historian

Forty-eight years of Rock Chippers Historian records are gone.

Our storage trailer was stolen from the church property where it had been located for many years. Confirmation that it is missing was noted on March 7, 2024. Subsequently the trailer was found and recovered by Rock Chippers and friends. However, the contents of the trailer were severely reduced by thieves. Here is at least a partial list of the missing contents:

Rock Chipper Historian records from October 1960 (the beginning of the Rock Chippers) to the year 2008 (forty-eight years of Historian records).

Gem Show display cases made of plywood sides and glass windows.

Electric-powered lights for the display cases.

Extension cords for 110-volt power to the lights.

- "Ways and Means" supplies that were intended to be used at Rock Chippers monthly meetings.
- "Spin-a-Wheel" game equipment that was intended to be used at Rock Chippers annual show.


