WINDING JUMP RINGS

If you need a few jump rings the same size, it's easy to grab a round rod and wind as many as you need. But when you need a lot of them, some form of winder saves a lot of time. A variable speed screw gun makes quick work of winding the coils. Screw guns are quite inexpensive at discount stores and are remarkably handy for odd jobs in the shop and around the house.

To wind a coil, just bend a right angle on the end of the wire about a half inch long and insert this into the screw gun chuck. Then wind slowly, keeping a tight coil. I like to rest the end of the mandrel on the edge of the table or bench pin. Finally, one note of caution. If you are winding an entire length of wire, be careful as you get near the end of the wire. If the end passes under your thumb, it can cause a nasty scratch or cut.

TOUCHING UP A BEZEL

Pumice wheels are good for touching up a bezel after you've set the stone. The hardness is about 6 on the Moh's scale, less hard than quartz, so it shouldn't scratch any of your agates or Jaspers. However, I'd avoid or be real careful of using pumice near the softer stones like Turquoise, Amber, Howlite, etc.

If you're unsure about the hardness of your wheels, test them on a piece of glass. Glass is about 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ on the Mohs scale, softer than quartz. So if the wheel doesn't harm glass, it's safe for use on the Quartzes and harder stones.



October's Birthstones—Opal and Tourmaline

Tourmaline is the name of a large group of boron silicate <u>minerals</u>. These minerals share a common crystal structure and similar physical properties - but vary tremendously in chemical composition. The wide range of compositions and color zoning within crystals causes tourmaline to occur in more colors and color combinations than any other mineral group.

Tourmaline is one of the world's most popular <u>gemstones</u> and it serves as a <u>birthstone</u> for the month of October. Because of its popularity, tourmaline is easy to find in jewelry stores. Well-formed tourmaline crystals are also valued by mineral specimen collectors. Specimens with attractive colors and crystal forms can sell for thousands of dollars.

Opal is one of the world's most popular <u>gemstones</u> and the <u>birthstone</u> for the month of October. A nice precious opal can flash every color of the spectrum with an intensity and quality of color that surpasses the fire of <u>dia-</u><u>mond</u>. The best opals command prices per carat that rival expensive diamonds, <u>rubies</u>, <u>sapphires</u>, and <u>emeralds</u>.


